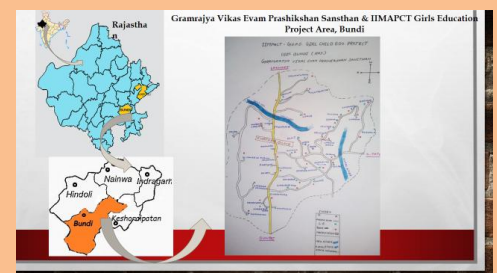
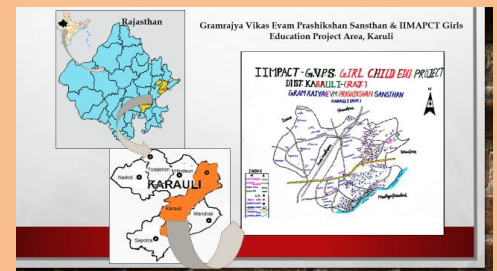
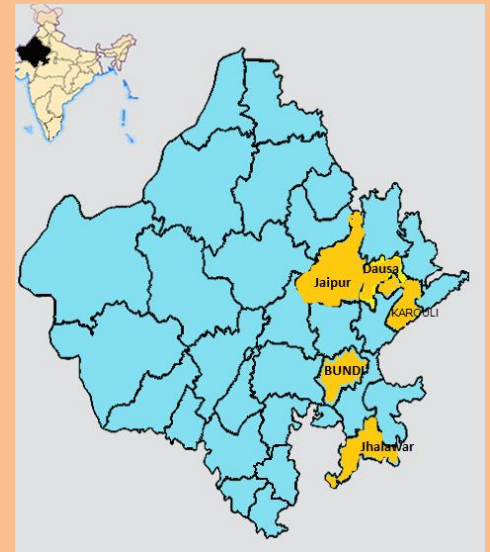

Maternal Health

In this context, nutrition is an excellent investment as it leads to better health and thus greater productivity, thus fueling the development process and leading to poverty reduction

This project is working towards improvement in the general and maternal health of communities, this project covers 30 villages in 12 Gram Panchayats in the Karouli and Bundi district. It facilitates to avail ante-natal and post-natal services from Govt. hospital.

To make pregnancy safer to all women through community action by improving access and practice to reproductive health service and better sanitation practice. The organization wants Government to ensure quality maternal health services universally available as an integral part of wider health

The sector focuses on:

- Strengthen of VHSNC and RMRS
- Raise maternal health related issues in Gram Sobha
- Capacity building of RMRS, VHSNCs
- Organized awareness camp
- Networking and advocacy

A major achievement for GVPS is that more and more people are now turning to the health facilities and health outreach Camps being organized by them and are shunning quacks that they consulted earlier.

It is a harsh reality, but in India, there are an abysmally large number of children who do not get a chance to even step into a school. They are left to fend for themselves on the streets, fighting off many forms of abuse. They do not have access to even primary healthcare. Mostly belonging to very poor families, these children are deprived of not only education but also their basic rights.

In the history of human rights, the rights of children are the most ratified. The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) defines Child Rights as the minimum entitlements and freedoms that should be afforded to every citizen below the age of 18 regardless of race, origin, colour, gender, language, religion, opinions, wealth, birth status, disability, or other characteristics

Girls Education Program, IMPACT

There are to 60 learning Centres are being running in Rajasthan by GramGramrajya Vikash Evam Prashikshan Sanshtan (GVPS) for slow learner from girls' child to mainstream them in the Government school. Among the 60 learning Centres, 40 learning centres are in Bundi District and 20 learning Centres are in karouli District. In the 60 learning Centres total 1786 girls are enrolled. For joyful learning of the students a library has been found where different colourful books are available for the students. There Audio visual teaching system is arranged for the student. In that system Laptop and projector screen are used to teach Mathematics, Hindi, and English very simply. So the student are attracted to come to their centre and they can also understand easily and can remember for a long days.

In girls education programme total students are 1786 (Bundi - 1186. Karouli - 600). Among them 176 girls from Bundi have been mainstreamed in the Government School. 60 Centres Management committee have been formed in 60 villages for monitoring the centres regularly. For the Cognitive development of the girl child, a library has been formed and Information technology is being used in education process. All the teachers (60) are trained regularly for their capacity building on different teaching techniques, TLM preparation, Centre management etc.


CRECHE Project Indian Council of Child Welfare (ICCW), Rajasthan.

GVPS is running crèche Centre in 4 villages of Dug block of Jhalwar & Toda Bhim Karauli District, most backward regions in south & east part of Rajasthan. The main objective of running crèche was to provide shelter to children of 0-6 year age when their mothers were out for work. Moreover, it also served many purposes,

- It did not deprive poor women of villages to go off their livelihood due to small children with them and;
- It provided exposure to children on pre nursery schooling.
- The crèche Centre is looking after the holistic development of children. Their nutrition and immunization are also taken care of. Their health chart & growth monitoring is doing regularly.
- It is commonly seen that burden of rearing small children falls on adolescent girls of the family due to which they are bound to drop out from schools. So, running crèche Centre

- Total student enrolment: 160

- They got 3 times meal regularly and also pre-primary education.

Urban Livelihood Mission

Sustainable livelihood is a crucial component of GVPS committed to poverty alleviation and integrated development. GVPS understands that elements like creating alternative earning opportunities, women's empowerment and the natural environment are closely interlinked.

Hence, they nurture opportunities depending on practicality. GVPS is supporting savings, access to micro finance as well as institution building, provide impetus to their financial empowerment. Together these initiatives help women to grow in influence and position, finally leading them to make a real change in their lives and the community and women managed income generating activity after getting different capacity building training.

GVPS operates this project for the economic empowerment of urban women. It aims at livelihood promotion for off-farm small business enterprises through 'Only Women' Self Help Groups

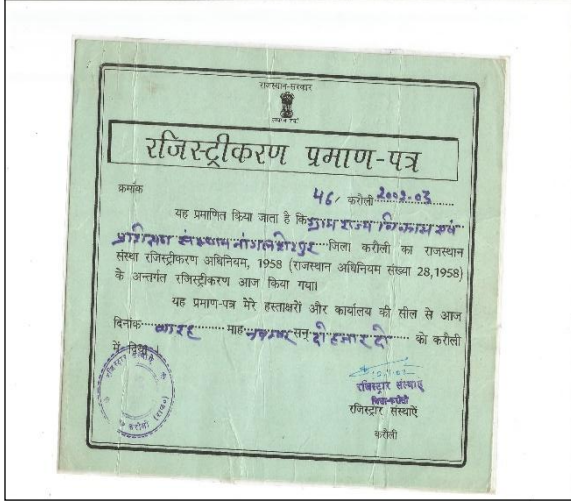

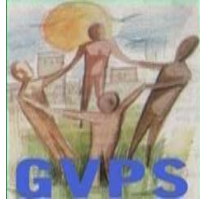
