GramrajyaVikasEvamPrashikshanSanstha (GVPS) is a non-profit, non-government development organization committed to improving the lives of disadvantaged communities in Rajasthan, India, utilising an integrated and sustainable approach. It prioritises participation and empowerment of local communities. GVPS evolved out of a grass root level organization in 2002 in the village of NangalSherpur in the Karauli district of Rajasthan. The organisation was registered under Rajasthan Society Registration Act, 1958. The organization, committed to improving lives of disadvantaged communities in Rajasthan, India, utilising an integrated and sustainable approach. It prioritises participation and empowerment of local communities. GVPS became involved in local efforts to enhance the well-being of communities that have been living in this region amongst these deficits. From its humble beginnings, GVPS today is a rapidly growing organisation supported by numerous donors. It implements specific community-need based programmes to reduce and ultimately eradicate poverty. It also links up environmental issues with human needs. GVPS, with long sustained experience understands that poverty reduction strategy must essentially address all the interlinked developmental issues an impoverished community faces every day. 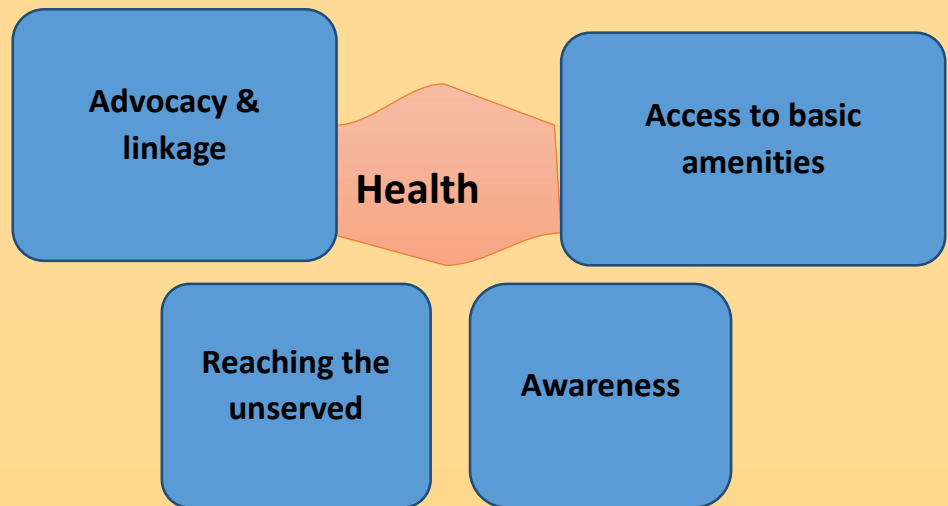

Health and Nutrition

- 1825 Pregnant women covered by ANC
- 1654 lactating mothers provided PNC I 100% new born babies immunized among reached out and addressed masses
- 3456 patients treated through outreach camp service
- Around 13500 families reached out through Health Services and Awareness Communication
- 1376 institutional delivery
- 324 malnourished mothers support to home based nutritional care support

Following the core principles of 'Equal Opportunity for All' and to attain the targets of Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) No. 2, we continue to strive at creating Health Care Access opportunities and making health care services accessible to the remotest areas of Rajasthan and through Mother and Child Health and Outreach Programmes. In addition, for a healthier tomorrow we begun stressing on Nutrition & Nutrition Promotional programmes in our operational areas and sometimes also beyond that.



GVPS's Mother and Child Health Programme in Rajasthan has now gained momentum and succeeded in providing Health Services to the unreached communities of remote area while creating awareness through campaigns, Health Camps, visiting individual houses, etc. The robust team of community health workers remained successful in mobilizing communities in remote villages gradually to give up unscientific and unsafe remedies offered by quacks and exorcists, and opt for scientific health care. This has resulted in a decrease in the Infant and Maternal Mortality Rate while ensuring safe motherhood, institutional intervention and improved community health at large. In order to consolidate the Community Health Programme and bring the community under the purview of Institutional Health Service.

Girls Education Program, IMPACT

There are to 60 learning Centres are being running in Rajasthan by GramrajyaVikashEvamPrashikshanSanshtan (GVPS) for slow learner from girls' child to mainstream them in the Government school. Among the 60 learning Centres, 40 learning centres are in Bundi District and 20 learning Centres are in karouli District. In the 60 learning Centres total 1786 girls are enrolled. For joyful learning of the students a library has been found where different colourful books are available for the students. There Audio visual teaching system is arranged for the student. In that system Laptop and projector screen are used to teach Mathematics, Hindi, and English very simply. So the student are attracted to come to their centre and they can also understand easily and can remember for a long days.

In girls education programme total students are 1792 (Bundi - 1192. Karouli - 600). Among them 176 girls from Bundi and 54 girls from Karouli have been mainstreamed in the Government School. 60 Centres Management committee have been formed in 60 villages for monitoring the centres regularly. For the Cognitive development of the girl child, a library has been formed and Information technology is being used in education process. All the teachers (60) are trained regularly for their capacity building on different teaching techniques, TLM preparation, Centre management etc.

- 40 centres in Bundi and 20 centres in Karauli have been timely open and up to date all documents
- 188 girls from Bundi mainstream in govt. School.
- Increase attendance of girls in centres from 53% to 84%

- After getting capacity building training, teaching learning material are prepared by all teachers
- Now the TLMs are available in the all centres and teachers regularly use those for teaching
- Monthly learning level monitoring and teacher focus on slow learner
- Promote library in all learning for child cognitive development
- Used information technology in 60 learning centre
- 60 CMC have formed in 60 villages and they regularly monitoring the centre
- Presently a good network has been developed with the different department, PRI and community

- Good support & coordination by community and Panchayat
